

Our Cookies Policy

This policy will explain to you what cookies are, which cookies we, the Stratford-upon-Avon Society ("the Society") Charity Registration Number 251182 use on our website https://www.stratfordsociety.co.uk (our site), why we use cookies and how you can select which cookies you want to receive from us.

Our website uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our site. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our site and also enables us to improve our site. By continuing to browse the site, you are agreeing to our use of cookies.

A cookie is a small data packet of letters and numbers that we provide to your browser for storage on the hard drive of your computer if you agree. Cookies contain information that is accessed on your subsequent visits to our site..

We use the following cookies:

- **Essential cookies.** These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website, or make use of e-ticketing services.
- Analytical/performance cookies. They allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors navigate around our website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users can easily find what they are looking for.
- **Functionality cookies**. These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences.
- **Targeting cookies.** These cookies record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We may use this information to make our website and the material displayed on it more relevant to your interests. We will not share this information with third parties.

You may notice on our website some cookies that are not related to the Society. For example, when you visit a page on our website with content embedded from Google, Twitter, YouTube or Facebook, these third-party websites may send cookies to your device. We do not control these cookies and you should check the applicable third party website for more information about these cookies.

You can block cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including essential cookies) please be aware that you may not be able to access some or all parts of our site.
